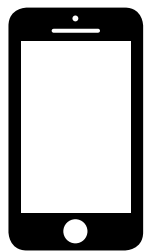

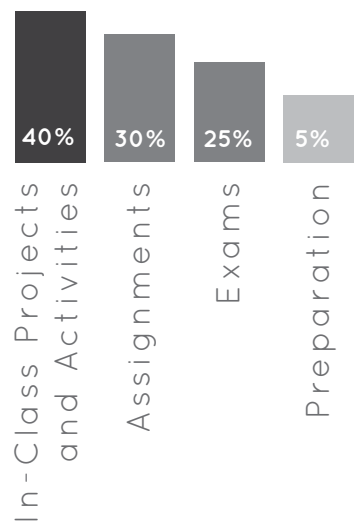

GRADES



Grades will be available online. Please check Skyward regularly, and feel free to ask me any questions you might have about a particular grade. I make mistakes, so this is your opportunity to make sure everything is correct! This can be done before or after class or via e-mail.

RULES AND EXPECTATIONS

***Students will maintain a respectful and positive attitude** toward the teacher and classmates. This includes listening when the teacher is speaking. Be kind to one another. Bullying is not tolerated in my classroom, period.

***Keep all graded work** until a grade is posted on Skyward, in case there are any inconsistencies.

***Stay with your lab group** until your teacher has excused you. Nobody likes to clean! Students who leave classmates behind will receive ZERO points for the entire lab.

***Use irons, sewing machines, and kitchen equipment responsibly.** Students who horse around will be given extremely boring bookwork during cooking and sewing units.

***Cell phones are not permitted in class** without permission.

***Bring a pen or pencil** and a good attitude to class each day.

***2 yards of non-stretch fabric** in contrasting prints (one yard of each print), and **one spool of coordinating thread** will be used to make an apron and is due no later than September 19.

- 5 Treat your classmates and teacher with respect.

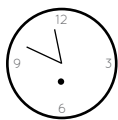
OR

CHEATING

 - *The student will be given a failing grade for that particular test, assignment, for the grading period, or for the semester.
- Students involved in cheating may be excluded from any/all school activities.**

For Your Information



- ***LATE WORK** is better than no work! 20% is deducted from late assignments.
- ***TEST RETAKES:** Your parent/guardian must sign the test acknowledging your grade. Return the test and schedule a retake with Mrs. Lummus **within 2 days of being passed back.** You can earn up to 80% when you retake a test.
- ***HALL PASSES:** Students are given two hall passes per quarter.



- ***LIFE HAPPENS!** If you are having issues at school or at home, have a huge exam coming up for science, or realize you need more time to complete your absolute best work for any other reason, e-mail me and request an extension. You must come talk to me or e-mail me **the day before** for the extension to be granted. You cannot come in 5 minutes before class without your assignment and expect an extension.



- ***HOMEWORK** is assigned once per unit, and is a practical application of what we are learning in class. Though home assignments are few, they are worth a large portion of your grade. Give homework assignments your best effort!
- ***CLASS WORK** and labs make up the majority of your grade. If you stay on task and complete in-class assignments, you will succeed.

ABSENTEE POLICY and CITIZENSHIP

- ***YES — WE DID SOMETHING IMPORTANT WHILE YOU WERE ABSENT.** It is your responsibility to check with me the day you return to class to find out what you missed. **Check the absent work crate for any missed handouts.** You have **ONE DAY** for each day you are absent to make up missed work. After that day, any missing assignments will be accepted with a **late penalty.** Any assignment you are absent for will be entered as a **ZERO** until it is turned in, including this disclosure.
- ***Citizenship grades** are determined by preparedness, attitude, behavior, respect, and tardiness.
